Seminar Objectives

The Public Sector Data Protection seminar aims to familiarise public sector officers with the *Public Sector Data Protection Policy (PSDPP)*. The Public Sector Data Protection seminar is envisaged as a means of creating general awareness of the policy amongst public officers and to equip them with an adequate understanding of the policy to ensure compliance within their respective agencies.

Seminar Details

The seminar presents an overview of the key aspects of the Public Sector Data Protection Policy, its implementation, as well as its effective deployment in the various arms of the Government of Singapore. The seminar will generally cover:

- Globally accepted Data Protection Principles and its development in Singapore;
- Adoption of TrustSg by the Government and its implications;
- Introduction to the IM8B Policy on Data Protection, its scope and requirements; and
- Compliance with the terms of the Data Protection Policy and examples of best practices.

Instructors

Assoc Prof Harry Tan is the Director of the Centre for Asia Pacific Technology Law & Policy [CAPTEL]. He is a Barrister (England & Wales) and an Advocate and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Singapore, a Solicitor of England and Wales. He is a *Fulbright Scholar* and also a *Visiting Scholar at the University of California, Berkeley*. He has authored numerous journal articles on E-Business Law. Together with Prof Toh See Kiat, he has also advised on and drafted laws for the Dubai Internet City and Dubai Port Authority. He has conducted executive programmes for the management of legal risks in E-Commerce and IT both locally and internationally. He has consulted for firms and government organisations in Singapore and abroad, and has published in top international journals.

Assoc Prof (Dr) Toh See Kiat is a Fellow of CAPTEL. Dr Toh See Kiat is concurrently Chairman of Goodwins Law Corporation. He is an Advocate and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Singapore, a Solicitor of England and Wales. Dr Toh practices and conducts seminars on information technology, intellectual property, commercial and corporate law. He has published numerous books, articles and papers on eBanking, EDI, eCommerce and Internet law. Together with Prof Harry Tan, he has also advised on and drafted laws for the Dubai Internet City and Dubai Port Authority. He is presently a member of the Board of Governors of Temasek Polytechnic, Singapore; a member of the National Trust Council, the National Internet Advisory Committee and the Singapore EDIFACT Committee; and member of the eCommerce Working Groups of the Asia-Pacific Council for Trade Facilitation and eBusiness (AFACT), the International Organisation of Standards (ISO) Consumer Policy Committee and the International Chamber of Commerce. He has also been a founder and Chairman of CommerceNet Singapore (part of a global consortium of eBusiness companies) since its inception in 1998. Dr Toh also sits on the National Trust Council and has worked on the TrustSg accreditation programme which all government agencies are accredited on. He has intimate knowledge and experience on how the process works and how accreditation can be lost. Dr Toh also sits on the National Internet Advisory Council that has recently been looking at spam regulation.
